#### **EXPLORE DONEGAL**

With its rich cultural heritage and breathtaking scenery,

Donegal is the perfect place to explore.

Check out the "Must See Sights" listed below.

#### **Wild Atlantic Way**

Out at the very edge of Europe, the Wild Atlantic Way (WAW) stretches for 2,500 km (1,500 miles) along Ireland's western seaboard from Malin Head in Co. Donegal to Kinsale in Co. Cork.

Donegal's Wild Atlantic Way is a 500km driving route that takes you through some of Ireland's most beautiful and unspoilt landscapes.

There are 39 Discovery Points in Donegal with the top 3 'Must See' Points of Malin Head, Fanad Head and Slliabh Liag.

## **Signature Locations Malin Head**

Ireland's most northerly point is surrounded by 3 sides with cliff and rock formations teeming wildlife and sea birds.

#### **Fanad Head**

Home of Fanad Lighthouse, with spectacular views of the Atlantic Ocean and Tory Island out at sea.

#### **Sliabh Liag**

The highest accessible sea cliffs in Europe reaching a height of 1,972 feet/601 meters with walks along the summit of the cliff.

# **Highly Recommended Glenveagh National Park**

Lying in the heart of the Derryveagh Mountains in the north-west of the county, the national park is a remote and hauntingly beautiful wilderness of rugged mountains, pristine lakes, tumbling waterfalls and enchanted oak woodland. At the centre of the park on the edge of Lough Veagh is the 19th century castellated mansion.


Getting to Donegal has never been easier. Whether if it's by land, sea, air or public transport, Donegal is much closer than you think.

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
